





Our Streetcar is an interactive drawing project. It invites participants to decorate their streetcar with their imaginations. They are encouraged to submit doodles, illustrations, phrases, words, and poems. These submissions will be incorporated into a vinyl wrap for the KC Streetcar.

The streetcar is for everyone. It is a spaceship of acceptance and interaction. I want to create an opportunity for people to put their mark on the streetcar. I want everyone to have a chance to imagine what they want the streetcar to look like. I want to turn our make believe into a reality, and I want to do it together.

I will spend one month accepting submissions for *Our Streetcar*. I will create a webpage for participants to send in submissions online, and I will set up submissions boxes at various locations including the Central Branch of the KC Library.

I will use selected submissions to design a final layout for the vinyl wrap.

I have made a few concept images, but the drawings will be those that are submitted, not the ones in the concept.

I have also made a submission sheet and a submission website at alpert.online/ourstreetcar.

Our Streetcar does not tell the public what their space should look like. Instead, this proposal invites the public to take ownership of and interact with their space while simultaneously encouraging imagination and cooperation.

Our Streetcar is more than a streetcar wrap.

Our Streetcar is a method of engagement.

In addition to the wrap, I will:

- invite artists to take a tour of the KC Streetcar facility and watch the wrap being applied.
- host an unveiling ceremony.
- design and publish a booklet featuring the selected work.
